

Focus on Volunteers

The CC&V volunteer program has been developed to reward regular full time Team Members for time spent volunteering in the community. Team Members may earn up to 40 hours of additional vacation time based upon 1 hour of vacation for each 3 hours of community service, or for each 2 hours of governmental service (such as serving on City Council or Planning Commission).

Volunteer Cindy Perez has worked at the CC&V lab since 1998. Originally from California she has lived in Cripple Creek for 15 years. Cindy volunteers for the Cripple Creek & Victor School District Booster Club. Look for her at the concession stand and out gathering sponsors for the school sports roster. She's earned an additional 40 hours of vacation time, and is eligible for the end of year drawing for \$500.

In the near future, you may also see Cindy volunteering at the Aspen Mine Center in Cripple Creek. The Aspen Mine provides a central location for the residents of the area to access a wide range of services. Eighteen agencies have offices in the Center, ranging from Community Cupboard, to Public Health, to the Salvation Army. Currently the Center is working to establish a Community Health clinic to provide health services. Stop by the Aspen Mine Center in Cripple Creek sometime and find out what they have to offer, or just to have a cup of coffee or ice cream cone at Cripple Creek Coffee, operated by Liana Walter (wife of Greg Walter, Engineering Department).
