

## The CC&V Rumor Mill

The rumor is that the mine will be mining through or under the City of Victor.

This is false.

CC&V is preparing the preliminary documents for a proposed mine life extension. We anticipate public roll out in July and submittal of materials for permits in early 2012.

Through the permitting process and CC&V's operations, the buffer areas established by agreement between CC&V and Teller County remain in place. The buffer around Victor includes all of the City of Victor and Goldfield. There is also a buffer area in place for Poverty Gulch on the east side of Cripple Creek.

The buffer establishes a limitation of no more than two acres of surface disturbance within the buffer for mining activities. The agreement only includes property owned by CC&V, as we could not place restrictions upon other property owners. The two acre limitation allows CC&V to conduct environmental compliance activities, such as ground water monitoring wells, or surface water hydrology management.

There are no plans, nor has there ever been a plan, to mine within the City limits of Victor.
