

Pet Projects

On August 9 & 10 the Max Fund Outreach Program rolled their mobile pet spay and neuter clinic into Victor. Organized by Teller County's Mariah's Promise, the clinic was held with the stated purpose of assisting the area with spay and neuter, as well as required vaccinations, for the residents of the area to help reduce pet overpopulation and disease.

Over the two-day clinic 33 cats and 30 dogs were altered. Several had to be turned away due to the overwhelming response to the clinic. Vaccinations were administered to 128 dogs and cats. Many were done at no cost when the pet owner was unable to pay the fee. CC&V's donation was used for the purchase of vaccinations.

The clinic was a cooperative effort between AARF, Feline Friends, Hamlett Spay & Neuter Clinic board members, Teller County Animal Control and Victor's Police Chief and Mayor.

The Max Fund has committed to return as often as possible to reach their goal to have all animals in the area vaccinated, and to provide alteration for as many animals as possible. A second clinic has not been scheduled, but will hopefully take place before the end of the year.
